4.	Committee Member Reports a. General Secretary Annual Report The General Secretary presented the Annual Report covering the period from April 2024 to March 2025. Full details of the report can be found in Annex B. The report provided a comprehensive overview of the year's activities, funding, and achievements. It was reported that the total amount of restricted grants received during the year was £153,924.80, which was utilised to run the FNC Centre, deliver various projects, and support ongoing centre activities. Additionally, unrestricted income £8,111.00 was generated through hall hire, coordination of projects, and skills and educations program organised at the FNC Centre. A highlight of the year was the FNC Charity Dinner Night held on 28 February 2025 to celebrate 20 years of FNC and to support the Town Mayor's Charity. The event was a great success, raising a total of £2,077.55 for FNC and £953.77 for the Town Mayor's Charity. The report also proudly acknowledged the recognition of the FNC Chairman, Capt (Retd) Rambahadur Pun who received the Town Mayor's Community Award 2024/2025 for his dedicated service to FNC and the wider community. The AGM expressed strong commendation for the accomplishments of the FNC Chairman. The Chairman emphasized that this award represented the collective effort of the entire community, acknowledging that he was merely the recipient on behalf of the FNC. b. 	Treasurer Bikram Rai presented the FNC Main Account Report, detailed in Annex C. The balance was £59,390.42 as of the reporting date. He noted the increase was primarily due to FNC Membership fees and additional events such as Nepalese Holi, November Food Festival (Pent Farm), and the FNC Charity Dinner Night, as mentioned in the General Secretary's report. c. Assistant Treasurer (GDPR) Report The Assistant Treasurer and GDPR Officer, Abesh Rai, took the opportunity to highlight the importance of data protection and compliance with GDPR regulations. He informed members that the FNC GDPR Policy is readily accessible on the official FNC website, and he encouraged all members to read the policy to stay informed and up to date. It was further noted that FNC reserves the right not to circulate internal communications to members who have moved away from the Folkestone area, in accordance with the policy and its relevance to the local community. d. Property Secretary Report The Property Secretary, Man Bahadur Rai, provided a report on the current inventory of property and equipment stored and in use at the FNC Centre. He detailed the list of new items acquired over the past year and expressed gratitude to those who contributed to these additions. A special vote of thanks was extended to the FNC Chairman, Capt (Retd) Rambahadur Pun, for kindly sponsoring the Nepalese New Year backdrop banner. A full list of items has been included in Annex D. e. Cultural Secretary Report The Assistant Cultural Secretary, Mr Ganesh Pun, offered thoughtful reflections on the importance of engaging younger members of the community in cultural activities. He suggested that greater time and budget allocation would be beneficial in encouraging their active participation and fostering a deeper connection with their heritage. In response, the Chairman affirmed that FNC remains committed to preserving and celebrating Nepalese culture. He outlined the FNC's ongoing efforts, including hosting major annual events such as the Nepalese New Year and Dashain Get-Together Celebrations. Additionally, FNC takes pride in participating in cultural festivals organised within Folkestone and also hosts public events like Nepalese Holi and the World in a Tent Festival, which serve as platforms to showcase traditional Nepalese dance and music. The Chairman further noted that the upcoming 2025 cultural highlight will be the Magar Culture Showcase, which is planned to take place on 6 July 2025 at the FNC Centre, in collaboration with ShivaNova and the Equator Festival. In previous two subsequent year the Cultural Showcase were on Rai and Limbu. f. Food & Beverage Secretary Report The Food and Beverage Secretary, Mr Chandra Shai, shared a report focusing on food and drink safety protocols followed during FNC events. He emphasised that clear safety standards are in place and are formalised through a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) between FNC and all food providers. g. Senior Citizen Coordinator Report

	Capt (Retd) Bishnu Singh, Executive Coordinator for Senior Citizens, joined the AGM virtually via Zoom due to prior work commitments. Alongside Chief Volunteer Advisor, Major (Retd) Deb Pun, he reported that senior citizen members of FNC continue to benefit from the facilities and support services available at the Centre. While the community has sadly experienced the loss of a few elder members due to age and health issues, it was noted with hope that new members are also arriving from Nepal to settle in Folkestone and are beginning to engage with the Centre. The Chairman, along with AGM participants, expressed heartfelt appreciation to both the Senior Citizen Coordinator and the Chief Volunteer for their dedication and to the FNC Centre staff for their consistent support and service. h. Other Reports It was noted that no reports were submitted this year by the Sports Secretary, Media Secretary, Ladies' Coordinator, or Youth Coordinator. Later, The Ladies Coordinator has confirmed that the FNC Teej Celebration will take place on Saturday, 23 Aug 2025, at the Ball Room of the Grand Bustin Hotel in Folkestone.

FNC Community Garden Project – Pent Farm: The General Secretary informed the AGM on the progress and governance of the FNC Community Garden Project at Pent Farm, referencing key documentation milestones. The FNC Chairman published formal meeting notes on 16 September 2024, outlining the roles, responsibilities, and future direction of the project. These were followed by detailed minutes published on 17 October 2024, which further clarified stakeholder involvement. A subsequent coordination meeting with ShivaNova, a key working partner in the project, was held and documented in the minutes published on 13 March 2025. Active engagement in cultivation is mandatory to ensure the overall success of the community garden. • Reallocation Policy: If a plot holder fails to maintain their plot or remain active, the project stakeholders reserve the right to reassign the plot to another eligible FNC member. • Adherence to Governance Documents: All plot holders must comply with the guidelines and sentiments outlined in the key governance documents, including the meeting notes published on 17 October 2024, and 13 March 2025.

9.	Any Other Business (AOB): a. London Marathon 2025 – Manda Gurung's Fundraising Initiative: The Chairman introduced Ms. Manda Gurung (FNC Member No 846), who will be participating in the London Marathon on 27 April 2025 in the Championship category—a significant achievement for an FNC member. Ms. Manda Gurung announced at the AGM her intention to raise funds for the FNC, inspired by the organization's impactful work within its membership and the broader community. The AGM attendees applauded her dedication and extended their best wishes for the marathon. Her fundraising profile has been widely circulated within the FNC network to garner support. b. Senior Citizens' Event Participation and Support: Senior citizen members inquired about subsidised ticket rates for FNC events, such as the Nepalese New Year celebration. The AGM acknowledged that while such subsidies were historically provided, evolving organisational practices aim to foster inclusivity and a sense of shared ownership among all members. 1. Introduction

Established in 2005, the Folkestone Nepalese Community (FNC) supports the growing Nepalese and Gurkha veteran population in Folkestone and surrounding areas. Our mission is to help them integrate into local society while preserving their rich culture, traditions, and heritage.

To strengthen its impact, FNC became a Charitable Incorporated Organisation (CIO) in October 2020. We are proud to be the first Nepalese community officially chosen as one of three charities supporting the Worshipful Town Mayor of Folkestone.

2. Our Mission

To unite and uplift Nepalese families and Gurkha veterans by fostering social inclusion, well-being, and cultural preservation, while providing essential support locally and internationally in partnership with public services and charitable organisations.

3. Our Objectives

- Advance education, skills, and career opportunities
- Relieve poverty, sickness, and distress
- Promote physical and mental well-being
- Provide recreational activities to combat loneliness
- Support community integration through language support and cultural exchanges
- Preserve and promote Nepalese history, culture, and traditions

- Foster intercultural dialogue and understanding
- Provide aid to disaster victims in Nepal
- Coordinate local fundraising and volunteer efforts
- Partner with charities to extend outreach and support
